#### The Leni Lenape Indians

Northern New Jersey's Original Inhabitants

**D**esigned for elementary school students, grades 3 and up. This educational workshop enables students to experience a variety of Native American traditions while learning about the culture of New Jersey's first inhabitants. Activities include: grinding corn; handling authentic animal skins for clothing; participating in Indian games; demonstrating hunting and fishing techniques; Topics include Native American family structure and their roles; transportation; daily life; games; food and agriculture; dwellings; environment; and spirituality. Students will view a variety of Native American artifacts of local origin.

#### Natural Fibers

Origins of the Textile Industry in Northern New Jersey.

**D**esigned for elementary school students, grades 3 and up. This educational workshop provides students with the history of textile manufacturing — one of Northern New Jersey's most prominent industries in the 18th and 19th Centuries. Each student actually spins natural fibers into thread using the traditional drop spindle technique and observes demonstrations of an early American spinning wheel and the weaving of textiles on a loom. Topics covered include Colonial-era cottage industries and Early American industrialization of textile manufacturing; development of industrial centers and markets for products; methods of shipping products to markets; sources of labor and manpower; sources of waterpower for textile mills; characteristics of natural fibers (silk, wool, cotton, linen) and where they come from; and specific histories about textile manufacturing in the cities of Paterson and Passaic.
